FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE ICERS ROSTER BACK TO FULL STRENGTH FOR WEEKEND TRIP TO MICHIGAN-DEARBORN

University Park, PA – January 27, 2005

The ACHA's No. 2 Penn State Icers (17-5-2) will travel to No. 8 Michigan-Dearborn (16-11-1) this weekend for a 7:30 p.m. game Friday and a 7:30 game Saturday. The Icers will have the services of seniors Kevin Jaeger, Joe Maglaque and Eric Harbaugh for the first time in 2005, as they return from Innsbruck, Austria where they helped lead Team USA to a 3-3 record and a ninth place finish at the World University Games.

The Icers will be more than happy to welcome the trio back, although they did hold their own in their absence, going 4-2 including a road win over No. 3 Ohio and a home win over No. 1 Rhode Island. They also won the Nittany Lion Invitational Tournament championship last weekend, besting No. 16 Mercyhurst and No. 19 Towson.

Penn State and Michigan-Dearborn met back in November at the Penn State Ice Pavilion, and the two teams split the weekend series, with the Icers winning 9-2 and losing 4-2. This weekend's match-up should be another good one, as Michigan-Dearborn has also beaten Ohio and Rhode Island, as well as No. 4 Illinois and No. 7 Robert Morris twice last weekend.

Despite missing the last six games, Jaeger and Maglaque are still first and third on the team in scoring, respectively, with 40 and 27 points. Jaeger and Mike Carrano are tied in goals with 18, and Jaeger also leads in assists with 22. Maglaque is fourth in assists with 18. In addition to that, Jaeger needs three points to reach 250 for his career, and seven goals to break Lynn Sipe's team record of 129.
