#2 ICERS TRAVEL TO #3 RHODE ISLAND IN BATTLE OF UNBEATENS

University Park, PA - November 4, 2004

The No. 2 Penn State Icers (9-0) will not get a rest after a dramatic two-win weekend over No. 1 Ohio this past weekend, as they will now travel to No. 3 Rhode Island (11-0) for games this Friday and Saturday each starting at 7:30 p.m.

The latest ACHA rankings are due out Friday, and it is expected that Penn State will take over the top spot while Rhode Island will move up to No. 2.

Penn State defeated Rhode Island in their only meeting last season. Penn State ended up finishing second at nationals while Rhode Island placed fourth.

Rhode Island is coming off of two 5-0 victories over the University of Scranton this past weekend. They are led by goaltender Anthony Feyock, who was ACHA Rookie of the Year last season, and ACHA All-America defenseman Matt Ranger. Joe Augustine is in his sixteenth season as head coach.

Penn State beat arch-rival Ohio in two, come-from-behind, 4-3 overtime victories last weekend, in what was a rematch of the last two ACHA national title games. Mike McMullen scored the game-winner before a packed house on Friday night, while Kevin Jaeger put in the clincher for the hat trick on Saturday. Jaeger's game-winner happened to be the 116th of his career, which moved him ahead of Rob Keegan and into sole possession of third place on the Icers all-time goal scoring list behind Lynn Sipe and Glenn Zuck.
