#1 ICERS LOOK TO BOUNCE BACK AFTER ROUGH WEEKEND WILL HOST MICHIGAN-DEARBORN

University Park, PA – November 11, 2004

The ACHA's newly-ranked No. 1 Penn State Icers (9-1-1) will play host to No. 15 Michigan-Dearborn (6-6-1) this weekend at the Ice Pavilion for two games; Friday at 9 p.m. and Saturday at 3:30 p.m. Both games will be broadcast on www.psuplaybook.org.

Penn State is coming off a very rough weekend at No. 3 Rhode Island, where they suffered the first loss of the season, 4-2, and the first tie of the season, with an unusual score of 0-0. In the loss, the Icers were uncharacteristically sluggish, and got out-shot 27-16, including zero shots in the second period. The two goals came from Kevin Jaeger and Mike McMullen. Saturday, however, was different as the Icers got off 38 shots to URI's 17, but they were unable to convert on any of them. On a side note, the Icers' Greg Schwind suffered a broken leg and will miss the rest of the season. Also, Jaeger was named the ACHA Player of the Week for the weekend of October 29 and 30, when he led the Icers to victory over then No. 1 Ohio with a hat trick and a game-winning overtime goal.

Michigan-Dearborn defeated Western Michigan by scores of 4-2 and 8-1 last weekend. Penn State defeated Michigan-Dearborn in all four of their meetings last season. After a slow start the Wolves have won 4 of their last 6 games under new Head Coach Dave Debol, a former star player at Michigan.

Saturday's game will feature a Dairy Queen product giveaway to the first 500 fans. Tickets for both games are on sale now.
