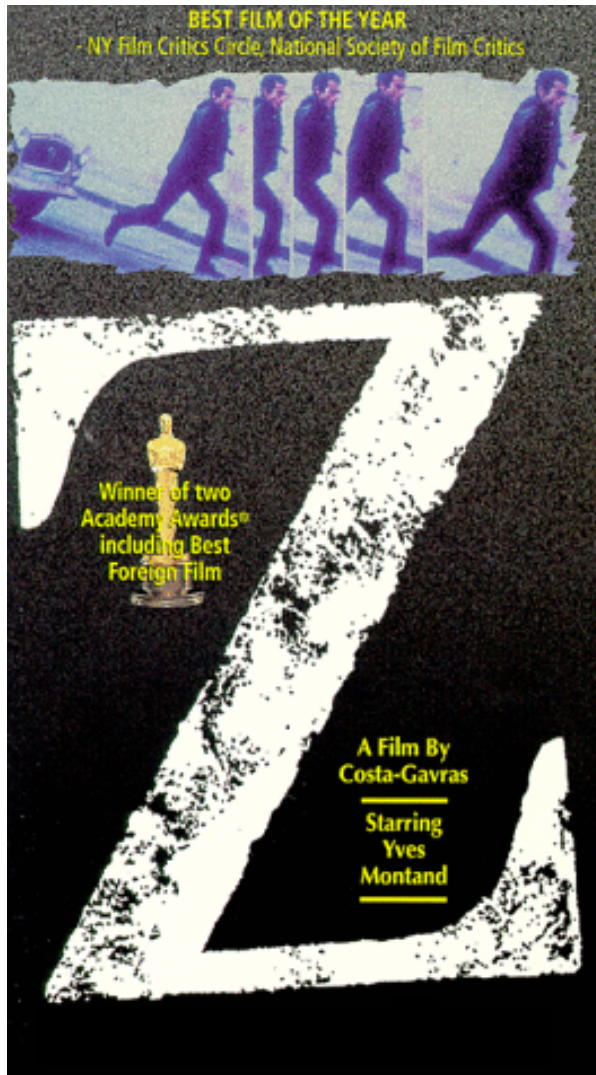


TURKISH ASSOCIATION for SECULARISM and KEMALISM†

Z is one of the most politically insightful films ever made, exposing government hypocrisy and cover-up in the wake of a political assassination. Director Costa-Gavras used actual trial transcripts of the investigation into the May 22, 1963 assassination of Greek pacifist leader Gregoris Lambrakis, which proved a government conspiracy in his death. Yves Montand gives the best dramatic performance of his life, and Irene Pappas stars as his wife Helena.
